

Interviews with 361 adult Americans who watched the presidential speech conducted by telephone (landline and cell) by ORC International on September 10, 2013. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 5 percentage points.

Survey respondents were first interviewed as part of a random national sample on September 6-9, 2013. In those interviews, respondents indicated they planned to watch tonight's speech and were willing to be re-interviewed after the speech.

Some questions were asked of each respondent both in the prespeech questionnaire on September 6-9 and on tonight's questionnaire. Where applicable, results for tonight's respondents from both the pre-speech survey and the post-speech survey are reported.

20% of the respondents who participated in tonight's survey identified themselves as Republicans, 37% identified themselves as Democrats, and 43% identified themselves as Independents.
